SPEAKERS

CLARE BOWDITCH



Clare Bowditch is a musician, broadcaster, sometimes actor, speaker, entrepreneur, and author. Somewhat of a slashie, you might say. She has won the coveted ARIA Award for Best Female for her music, the Rolling Stone Woman of the Year Award for her contribution to Australian culture, and has been nominated for a Logie Award for her role as Rosanna on popular television show *Offspring*. Her first book, a partial memoir entitled *"Your Own Kind Of Girl"* was released through Allen & Unwin in Oct 2019 and won the ABIA for Best New Writer. In 2020 she took the themes from her memoir and released a skill-building audio book entitled *"Tame Your Inner Critic"*.

CHIARA KICKDRUM



Born and raised in Torino, Italy, Chiara is a classical and electronic film & TV composer now based in Australia.

In 2018, Chiara has composed the original soundtrack for Cannes Film Festival Palme D'Or winner *All These Creatures* and more recently for feature film *Long Story Short*. She recently also composed the original music for TV series for STAN, ABC and SBS, as well as for contemporary dance company Chunky Move's latest show which just premiered at Sydney Festival.

MINDY MENG WANG



Mindy Meng Wang is a versatile Chinese/Australian Composer and world leading contemporary Guzheng (ancient Chinese harp) Performing Artist. She performs regularly in many events, festivals and top venues, and her collaborators include Regurgitator, Tim Shiel, Paul Grabowsky and Deborah Cheetham among others. Mindy's work explores the fertile space between traditional and contemporary practices, and is part of a significant movement of Chinese musicians redefining and reinvigorating their musical tradition. She is a strong voice for young female composers and artists of Chinese heritage on the global stage.

MERIDA SUSSEX



Merida Sussex is a co-founder of the award winning independent record label, Stolen Recordings. Established in London in 2005, Stolen is recognised for the quality and integrity of its releases. Merida was the lead singer in The Paradise Motel, which allows her to bring an invaluable perspective to the label, ensuring that personal artist development is always front of mind. Merida is a co-founder of the Envoke blockchain project, and as an artist herself, is driven to improve copyright, licensing and payment systems so creators can be paid fairly, transparently and in a timely and frictionless manner. She has served two terms on both the Association of Independent Music (UK) and the Merlin boards.

CHARLES JENKINS



Charles Jenkins is a Melbourne songwriter/musician, producer, performer and teacher with more than 30 years experience in the Australian Music Industry.

He has released 20 albums, toured Europe and the USA several times and been nominated for two ARIA awards with the leceream Hands. In 2014 he won the AGE/Music Victoria award for best folk/roots album and in August 2020 leceream Hands released their first album in 13 years — *No Weapon But Love.* In Dec 2021 he released his latest solo album *Radio Sketches.*

CHRIS O'NEIL



Artist, advocate and industry stalwart Chris O'Neill has been committed to music for more than a decade. Chris makes a daily contribution to supporting songwriters through his role at APRA AMCOS as Director – Membership & Stakeholder Engagement, where he regularly engages with industry organisations around the country, whilst rolling out the APRA AMCOS national events program, and managing the APRA AMCOS grants program. Chris is also deputy chair of Music Victoria. An acclaimed drummer, Chris has written and performed with artists from just about every genre, made numerous records, and performed on stages around the country including major festivals such as Prima Vera, Splendour in the Grass and Big Day Out.

WOODES



Over the past year Kutcha has completed a new album, '*Circling Time*' and written another show '*Circling Time Songs & Stories*' which will be touring in May to 26 venues throughout regional Victoria. As a proud Mutti Mutti man Kutcha is a strong advocate for Aboriginal people as well as being a multi award winning singer/songwriter.
